What Happened at the Meeting



Sherri Street, Downtown Development Coordinator for the City of Temple (shown above with Lion Boss Randy), spoke today about Temple's downtown redevelopment.

The position was adopted in the 2015-2016 budget. The full-time staff member works to revitalize and redevelop the city's downtown area as well as assist with retail development, infrastructure improvements and event coordination.

"I am looking forward to working in Downtown Temple amidst such beautiful historical buildings, exciting cultural activities, and warm, inviting people," Street said in a news release. "I think there is an enormous opportunity to help transform the downtown area into a popular destination for residents and visitors alike and I can't wait to get started."

Street spent the past nine years working as the executive director for Keep Waco Beautiful, where she provided leadership and administrative guidance for the organization, recruited thousands of volunteers annually and increased grant funding, the release said.
